



Inaugural PAC event benefits school

— The much anticipated opening of the \$16 million Robson Performing Arts Center is coming the first week of August.

Four performances of “Beauty & the Beast,” performed by the Professional Oklahoma Shakespearean Festival Touring Company will launch the Center built for the benefit of the Claremore Public Schools by primary benefactors Frank and Ludmila Robson.

All proceeds from the grand opening performance will benefit the Claremore Public Schools Foundation (CPSF). CPSF provides educational materials, programs and equipment for the schools, which are not available through regular district funding. The Foundation is solely funded through contributions from the community.

The Robson Performing Arts Center is located in Claremore, 101 E. Stuart Roosa Blvd.

Since its inception in 1988, the Claremore Pubic School Foundation has awarded over \$700,000 in grants.

The Robson PAC is a brand new 72,000 square foot facility, designed by Wozencraft Mowery and Associates, which seats 1,018. The PAC will also be home to classrooms for Claremore Junior High and High School band, chorus, speech and drama programs. The Robson PAC also includes a Black Box theatre with seating for up to 200.
