



## Robson PAC schedules performances for the new year

Performing and also serving as musical director is Jeff Lankov, musical director for the Radio City Music Hall Rockettes Christmas show.

Tickets to "Love is Here to Stay" will go on sale Jan. 8, with performances Feb. 9-10.

"There are so many wonderful things happening with the Center," Quinn said. "We are working on having a full season. We are also going to have a summer season full of musicals and performances." Volunteers are needed. "Whether it be ushers, technical help or ticket sales, we would love to welcome you to the Center," Quinn said.

The Select-A-Seat campaign to purchase auditorium seats wrapped up at the end of December.
